

Zagadnienia na egzamin wstępny na studia II stopnia:

Filologia angielska

Filologia angielska z elementami translatoryki

Egzamin wstępny będzie miał formę rozmowy kwalifikacyjnej przeprowadzonej w języku angielskim. Celem rozmowy jest ocena predyspozycji kierunkowych kandydata oraz jego kompetencji językowej.

Egzamin wstępny z języka angielskiego jest egzaminem ustnym i ma charakter rozmowy z egzaminatorem. Egzamin trwa ok. 10 minut (zdający nie ma dodatkowego czasu na przygotowanie się/zapoznanie się z treścią zestawu pytań).

Pytania egzaminacyjne

LITERATUROZNAWCZE:

1. Discuss the significance of William Shakespeare as a poet and as a playwright.
2. Discuss the features of 17th century metaphysical poetry in England.
3. Discuss the beginnings of the English novel.
4. Discuss the features of British Victorian novel on the basis of the works of a writer of choice.
5. Characterize American Romanticism and discuss a writer of choice as its representative (e.g., Herman Melville, Nathaniel Hawthorne, Edgar Allan Poe, Walt Whitman, Emily Dickinson or other).
6. Characterize American Naturalism and discuss a writer of choice as its representative (e.g., Stephen Crane, Theodore Dreiser or other).
7. Characterize American Modernism and discuss a writer of choice as its representative (e.g., Ezra Pound, Gertrude Stein, T.S. Elliot, William Faulkner, Ernest Hemingway or other).
8. Characterize American Postmodern Literature and discuss a writer of choice as its representative (e.g., Thomas Pynchon, John Barth, Donald Barthelme or other).
9. Discuss the notion of intertextuality as it has been theorized by Gérard Genette and/or Julia Kristeva. How does this notion relate to Roland Barthes' postulated "death of the author"?
10. Discuss the main premises of feminist approach(es) to literature.

JĘZYKOZNAWCZE:

1. Explain the difference between a dialect, an idiolect, and a register.

2. Discuss the main research methods used in linguistics.
3. Explain the differences between descriptive and prescriptive approaches to grammar.
4. Discuss the role of English as a global lingua franca.
5. Describe the differences between phonetics and phonology.
6. Explain the different types of lexical relations.
7. Illustrate how first language acquisition differs from second language acquisition.
8. Highlight the basic differences between syntax and morphology.
9. Describe and compare various word formation processes in English, providing examples.
10. Discuss some characteristics of American and British English.
