The courses are focused on diachronic linguistics, etymology, onomastics and the cognitive trend in linguistics. Students are introduced to the basics of etymologic analysis and the types of proper names, as well to main concepts, mechanisms and phenomena dealt with by cognitive linguistics. They also carry out cognitive analysis of language pertaining to different discourse types. The courses in Applied Linguistics are centered around the questions of language acquisition and the learning theory (the behaviorist, cognitivist and constructivist approaches), as well as the differences between human and animal communication systems.
